

Let's Be Salt Smart!

Here are a few Salt Smart tips to help you protect our waterways, environment and pets during the winter when using de-icing salt!

Always Shovel First!

Clear snow from sidewalks and driveways **before** the snow turns into ice.

Less ice means you need less salt!



More Isn't Always Best!

A 12oz cup of salt is enough to melt the ice on 10 sidewalk squares!



Don't Clump It Up!

A little salt goes a long way! Salt should be spread with space in between each grain.



Clean Up!

Always sweep up any leftover salt so it doesn't get washed away into our streams and lakes!



Follow these instructions and you can be Salt Smart!



Where Should You Salt?

More isn't always better! Salt on the roads and sidewalks can end up in our rivers and streams and damage our environment and water sources.

When you salt, remove as much snow as you can using a shovel or a scraper. Then apply salt **ONLY** to the areas with icy patches where people walk or drive.

Circle all the areas where it is okay to use salt.
