

**Dominion Water/Nottoway Storage Tank Rehabilitation
Project Summary**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is the timeline of the project?

The project is scheduled to begin in late March 2025 and end in late June 2025.

2. What is involved with the tank rehabilitation project?

The rehabilitation project will involve sandblasting and painting the interior of the tank, re-painting the exterior of the tank, cleaning and overcoating the tank interiors, and repainting the exteriors. We are protecting the structure from environmental exposure and preventing minor surface issues from developing into more serious problems that could compromise the tank's integrity over time. The installation of a butterfly valve and check valves, along with surface preparation and protective measures for existing equipment, enhances system reliability, facilitates maintenance access, and ensures the long-term durability of the tank through proper cleaning and recoating of both interior and exterior surfaces.

3. Why is Prince William Water doing this project?

In 2014, Prince William Water began a rehabilitation program for all its water storage tanks. Rehabilitating a water tank preserves the life of the structure and maintains the quality of drinking water for our customers. After the Dominion Tank/Nottoway rehabilitations are complete, Prince William Water will clean and inspect the facility every three to five years before performing a full condition assessment after 15 years.

4. Will the rehabilitation project affect my water service or water pressure?

No.

5. Will there be a difference in the taste or odor of my water during the project or after it is finished?

No, this project will not affect the taste or odor of your drinking water.

6. Where will the project contractor park vehicles?

The contractor will park vehicles at the project site or near the entrance to the site along a Prince William Water-maintained access road.

7. What are the approved work hours for this project?

The project work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday, and Saturday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., excluding Prince William County-recognized holidays. The contractor may only work extended weekday hours or weekends with specific, advance approval from Prince William Water.

8. Will the project have any other impacts on the surrounding residential community?

Yes. There may be some moderate noise during the sandblasting and painting processes.
