This year's competition received 176 entries in painting/drawing, computer graphics and photography from students representing 12 high schools in Prince William County and the City of Manassas Park. The theme for this year's competition, "One Water," highlights the connection between water and life; no matter who we are, where we live or what we do, water connects us all.
